
From the Pastor

This Lenten season we are journeying through the Dark Woods. For some, this is a time of reflection, for some a time of exploration, and for others a time of uncertainty. For all of us, it is a time to intentionally journey with God through the darkest parts of our lives with the hope of seeking the Light as we move toward the Resurrection. The darkness is meant to be a gift in our lives and if we truly allow ourselves to open up, to empty, and to experience God in this journey, it will be the greatest gift.

The season of Lent brings so many wonderful opportunities and ministries in the life of the Church. Seven people from our Church and Society went to D.C. last month as part of the Food Insecurity work they've done in partnership with the Sparta UMC and the Denville Community Church. All of the work done was funded by a grant we applied for from GNJ.

In D.C. we went to the United Methodist Building where we received training on how Church and Society advocates for those whose voices go unheard and the issues that are important to us as United Methodists. We learned about the racial wealth gap in this country and received training on how to communicate with our legislators in person and in writing. We had time with staffers of Sen. Menendez as well as Reps. Kean and Sherrill. We shared with them how we would like them to vote and how budget appropriations should focus on the common good.


Trinity Scholarships Available

Applications for the 2024 Trinity United Methodist Church's student scholarships will be available starting March 1st. Students may request an application by contacting the church office, or by going to the Trinity website. All completed applications are due by Friday, May 3rd at noon.

There are 10 different scholarships available including ones for both beginning and continuing students. The description of each scholarship and its qualifications are included in the application package. Students are encouraged to apply for all the scholarships that they are qualified for. Last year 14 students were awarded scholarships, totaling over \$19,000 under this program. Pastor Deb to Begin Renewal Leave


Under Paragraph 350.3 of The United Methodist Book of Discipline (2016), "a clergy member may request a formational and spiritual growth leave of up to six months while continuing to hold an appointment in the local church. Such leaves are available to clergy members who have held full-time appointments for at least six years." Such a leave is defined as a time freed from normal duties in order to pursue spiritual and personal growth in the practice of ministry, and/or acquiring knowledge in related fields. Renewal leave is intended to prepare pastors to return to their pastoral appointments, empowered to continue their ministries.

Pastor Deb is in her ninth year of full-time ministry. She will be on renewal leave beginning April 1 and returning on May 13. For part of this time, she will be on a silent retreat with in-depth spiritual direction.

Pastor Deb has been empowering the ministry teams she works with to function and assert their agency. She is confident that they will continue to work on their goals and fulfill their objectives well in her absence. She preaches once a month which means within a six-week period, once or possibly twice, which can be covered by others.

During her leave, if any pastoral or ministry-related needs arise, please contact the church office or Pastor Erica.

We gathered near St. Vartan Park to set up tables to distribute what we brought and we served 30 people that morning, sharing stories and love. The food nourished bodies and equally important (if not more so!) were the conversations that nourished our souls with everyone who came to partake. Our next run is on May 4th, and we hope those of you who are 18 years old and up will consider joining us for it; keep an eye out for the Just Say Yes to sign up!
